

December 4...This is the Second Sunday in Advent. The gospel lesson is from Matthew 3:1-12. John the Baptist and "Homeless Jesus" tell us how to prepare: Go out into the streets, find someone who thinks they are alone, convince them they are not. Pastor Paul will preach.

December 11...On this Third Sunday in Advent we will look at Matthew 11:2-11. Pastor Paul will be preaching. Sometimes our expectations see things not there; conversely, sometimes, things right in front of our faces are the hardest to see. What do we want to see this season?
