A website was given a face lift. Our church sign informed those stopped at 103rd and Boswell. Trips were taken to experience new cultures and groups came to visit us. Bread was broken – fellowship was extended. Popcorn was consumed while movies were watched. A patio was poured. There was an increase of mission dollars sent locally, nationally, and globally. People who had been ostracized were provided with an extravagant welcome! Toes were stepped on, challenges extended. Worship provided divine moments in which the angels themselves seemed to be singing and/or playing. An installation occurred. Breakfasts were tasty and informative. New officers were installed while some moved on to other opportunities. You were you, and I was me, and together we were a rainbow of God's beloved children - The Church of the Palms!



August Water Drive for Children First Academy

Children First Academy is a church in Phoenix that serves homeless and extremely low income students. A fleet of buses picks up students from shelters and temporary housing units throughout the greater Phoenix area. Often, students are on the busses for extended periods of time. The school, which we support through our Board of Mission and Outreach, has requested our help by providing bottled water to give to students for their ride on the bus to and from school. The busses are not air conditioned so it is important that students stay hydrated. The water drive will be held on August 6th and 13^{th} . You can help by providing a case of bottled water or donating cash, which the Board of Mission and Outreach will use to purchase cases of water. STEADFAST HOPE: THE PALESTINIAN QUEST FOR A JUST PEACE Beth Moore

Earlier this year, I volunteered to facilitate a series of sessions for interested Church of the Palms members to learn about the conflict in the Holy Land. Twenty of us met for five times, and using a resource called <u>Steadfast Hope</u> (created by the Presbyterian Church's



Israel-Palestine Mission Network) we began to increase our understandings of what has happened in that part of the world since 1948 with the founding of the state of Israel.

We sought to understand the narratives that Palestinian and Israeli peoples have for the same historical events. There were words we didn't know — like Nakba (Arabic for catastrophe and

the name that Palestinians give to the events of 1948 during which 750,000 of them were forced to flee their homes because of violence directed against them by Jewish military groups seeking to secure the land for what would become the state of Israel). In an accompanying video we heard Israeli and American Jews share their perspectives on what has happened over the years, and the threat that they believe the current occupation of the West Bank by Israel poses to the soul of the Jewish people, and the lives of the Palestinians — both Christian and Muslim — who live there. We also explored Christian Zionism and the role that many in the US Christian community have played in supporting Israeli taking of all the land of Ancient Judea and Samaria. In the news we hear predominantly about the violent attacks by Palestinians on Israelis. We did not know of the non-violent resistance in which most Palestinians are engaged: trying to live in peace on land that has been in their family for generations. We found ourselves frequently asking the questions: Why haven't we heard these stories? We talked about how we might share some of the things we learned with our wider community. This brief article is an initial attempt to do this. On the second <u>Sunday in June, we will have some printed materials on the background of this conflict</u> available at the table selling Equal Exchange products . We hope you'll stop by and pick up a copy, and speak with one of the individuals who participated in the study. There is a copy of <u>Steadfast Hope</u> in the Church library. We plan to continue our educational efforts over this next year as part of the work of the new Social Justice Team at The Church of the Palms.

Sunday, June 4th Pentecost Sunday



For Christians, Pentecost is a holiday on which we commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost,

which came a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church." Thus, from an historical point of view, Pentecost is the day on which the church was started. This is also true from a spiritual perspective, since the Spirit brings the church into existence and enlivens it. Thus Pentecost is the church's birthday. On the day of Pentecost, seven weeks after the resurrection of Jesus, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon those followers of Jesus who had gathered together in Jerusalem. What happened on the first Pentecost continues to happen to Christians throughout the world today, though usually not in such a dramatic fashion. We rarely get a heavenly wind and tongues of fire anymore. Nevertheless, God pours out the Spirit upon all who put their faith in Jesus Christ and become his disciples.



Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening from \$149 (\$139 with our member discount).




