Do we own our possessions, or do they own us? That will test me over and over and over again this month.

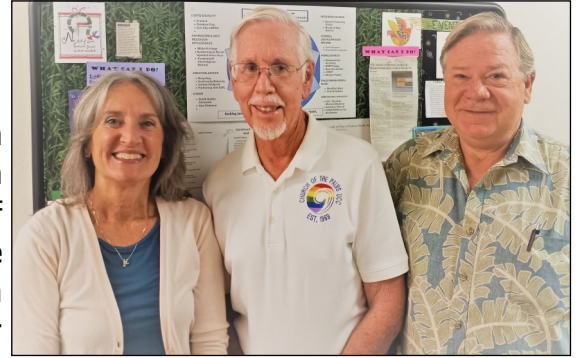
Just know that I am glad to be your pastor and I am glad you are part of The Church of the Palms.

Upcoming Class: A Safe Space for Starting Conversations about Suicide and its Prevention

Kay Klinkenborg will facilitate two classes on suicide from **10:00-11:30 a.m., Nov. 9th and 16th**, in King Hall and online via Bridges. Masks are required and seating with social distancing. This will be a safe (unrecorded) environment to talk about one of the most difficult subjects in our lives: words hard to say — suicide and suicide prevention. The class will provide an opportunity to learn tools, resources and creative ways to have a real conversation with the people in your life. You don't need special training to have an open, authentic conversation about mental health. Often, just talking about it can be the first important step in staying connected for yourself or someone else and helping get support or treatment if needed.

Bringing up the subject of suicide DOES NOT increase the chances that a person will become suicidal or be more apt to act on such thoughts or impulses. In fact, it is just the opposite.

A sacred circle of safety will be the structure of the classes. Most people in our age range have some personal experience with suicide of someone they know. Some know the private struggle of suicidal thoughts or plans. Safe, non-judgmental listening will be modeled when personal stories are shared. One hard fact is that the senior citizen population is at high risk for suicide in America. There is the possibility that our loved ones, family members, grandchildren, friends, etc., could present with suicidal tendencies at any time. These classes give us an opportunity to become informed on how to be supportive and caring during these difficult encounters.

This is an integrated program designed from two sources: The book, The Living Saving Church: Faith Communities and Suicide Prevention by Rev. Rachael A. Keefe, a memoir and practical guide for educating congregations about talking about suicide and prevention paradigms. It's available on Amazon.com in paperback, Kindle or used. The church office has 5 copies for those wishing to borrow the book. Reading the book is not mandatory for attending the classes. The second source for the classes: professional and volunteer training models on suicide prevention collected by Kay Klinkenborg.

Topics covered (but not limited to): current statistics across age-groups; risk factors; warning signs; you hear "talk of suicide...what to do"; Triple A's Model of Prevention; survivors responses to suicide; self-care; the church's response to suicide; resources for help... for individual use or to share; and scriptures of hope. Short DVDs, didactic presentation and learning from each other are the modalities of these classes.

Kay Klinkenborg currently is a Spiritual Director/Companion; a retired RN, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT) and Clinical Member of AAMFT (American Assoc. of Marriage & Family Therapists). Kay is a member of Church of the Palms.

Meals On Wheels are available in Sun City / Youngstown 7 days a week. Meals are delivered between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Someone must be home to receive the meals, as they cannot just leave the food on the street. Arrangements can be made for the delivery person to bring the food into your home if your door is left unlocked, and this can be discussed at the initial interview.

The cost of the meals is \$8.50 per day, and this includes one hot meal, plus another cold meal per day. A nutritionist oversees the meals provided from Sun Valley Lunch. To get on the Meals On Wheels Plan, please call 623.974.9430 and set up an interview with a Meals On Wheels representative to get the process officially moving forward. Someone from Meals On Wheels will come to your house with a contract for you to sign to make this official. There is a 2-week deposit so the food can be ordered.

If there are financial hardships, please let the Meals On Wheels representative know this when you do the interview so they know your needs, and they will do all they can to make this affordable for you.

A Typical Hot Meal has a protein, starch, and vegetable, and the cold meal has a sandwich, milk and a cookie.

Special Diets can be accommodated with a prescription from your doctor detailing the special dietary concerns that you need.

A Challenge: Reducing our household's carbon footprint

I last wrote to you in April of this year about the work Church of the Palms has embarked on to care for God's creation by reducing our "carbon footprint" — the amount of CO2 we put into the environment. We began the work of reducing our carbon footprint by installing solar panels on the church (projected to reduce our CO2 emissions from electricity by 50%) and are continuing it by upgrading interior lighting and external air conditioning units to reflect the most energy efficient products on the market.

Our Creation Justice Team invites you to become a part of this process. We will gather Nov. 16th at 9 a.m. (in person and online) to learn how to calculate our household "carbon footprint," as well as examine the impact that our individual actions can have on reducing it.

Our session will include a quick review of the impact carbon dioxide has on God's planet earth, offer an interactive demonstration of the Cool Congregation's Household Calculator and hear from you about steps you are taking to reduce your carbon footprint. We'll also share a list of 25 things you can do that cost less than \$25 but collectively will make a significant difference in reducing CO2.

My article in April was entitled "Know your power source". I wrote about our power source as Christians being love, and the fact that our love of God is manifest in our love of Neighbor, love of Creation and love of Children. Indeed, this is what being the Church of the Palms is all about. We are the hands of God in our world. So come learn with us about ways we can deepen our love of creation.

Flower Ministry at Church of the Palms

Hello Church Family,

As we approach a new year, I wanted to describe the flower ministry that we have here at The Palms for those who aren't aware. I hope you have noticed, either in person or online, that we strive to have fresh flowers on the altar every Sunday. On any given Sunday, flower orders are placed by individuals in honor of, in celebration of, in memory of a life event or a loved one. They donate a minimum of \$30.00 for a simple vase arrangement. I then purchase the stems and create the arrangement on Sunday mornings. I am at the mercy of regular market floral choices as far as what I use. If someone wishes a more extravagant arrangement, they may spend as much for the stems as they desire. I can usually order specific stems if requested. I cannot guarantee that they will be available, but I try my best.

When personal arrangements are not ordered, the cost comes out of special funds that are not part of the budget. I encourage you to participate in this ministry in order to keep the fund alive so that the church may always enjoy live flowers. I believe that their presence adds warmth and a connectivity to the natural world as we experience the service.

The yearly cost of a \$30.00 arrangement every Sunday is \$1,560.00. If you don't have a specific Sunday in mind, a general donation to the flower fund would be most appreciated. You may use any offering envelope to donate to the fund. Mark "floral fund" in the subject line. If the donation is for a specific reason, please call or send information to Lindsey, the office manager: manager@thepalms.org or 623.977.8359. She will add the announcement to the Sunday bulletin to which it pertains. She also forwards the information to me.

Arrangements may be taken away after the service. If they were not ordered by someone specific, they are certainly available for anyone to take and make someone's day a little happier. Care Team has a list of folks that they may take them to if accessible because of COVID regulations. Keep in mind that if you take an arrangement, the vessels have all been donated and I can certainly reuse them if they can be returned. There is no hurry. Please see me after service to make sure that the arrangement is available that day. Otherwise, they are left for the office staff to enjoy.
