Michael would smile in the hospital every time he would hear my voice. I'd

be across the room and say something, and Michael would smile and try to find me. The nurses kept saying that it must be gas. They couldn't convince me. I saw with a proud dad's eyes; That boy was smiling!

Nathan was 10 lbs. 8 oz. when he was born. What made him seem even bigger was the fact that all the other babies born that day in the hospital were in the 5 lbs. range. They looked like tiny chickens next to the turkeys in the grocery store freezer. The church had given us literally over a thousand diapers all of which were for normal sized newborns(10lbs and under). None of them fit. The women's shelter got the blessing of those gifts, and I went to the store for ones that fit over his thighs.

When Ruthie was born, she cried every time anyone held her, except Wendy. We had lots of grandma-types in the church try to hold her. Ruthie would start crying the second she'd left her mother's side. Then Wendy would take Ruthie and instantaneously Ruthie would stop crying. It happened so many times that the joke at church was that Ruthie was attached to Wendy with Velcro at the hip!

You and I have another baby in our arms today, baby Jesus. What are we going to do with baby Jesus?

Is baby Jesus looking for our voice of unconditional love across a crowded world? Will his birth inspire us to provide justice to the needy? He's not just someone you can put down; Can you welcome his attachment to you in your heart and soul? I can't wait to see how this new year develops.

W.I.S.E. CERTIFICATION: WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

Why the anacronym W.I.S.E? **Welcoming, Inclusive, Engaging and Supportive** are the words that become the 'mission statement' of providing mental health awareness and mental health first aid volunteers to our congregation and community. Mental Health First Aid Volunteers are trained individuals that prepare themselves to be available during times of stress, loss, depression or any event that is challenging a person's stable coping behaviors.

It all began in January of 2020 when Pastor Jim Alexander stepped forward to guide The Church of the Palms through a certification process to become a certified W.I.S.E. Congregation sanctioned through the United Church of Christ Mental Health Network and the Southwest Conference of the United Church of Christ (of which we are a regional member).

A W.I.S.E Steering Committee was formed and members recruited who were invested in becoming certified in Mental Health First Aid responders; a course developed and accredited by the National Council of Behavioral Health. Several people stepped forward to do the 40 hour training and those that successfully completed the course and now wear identifying green badges when at church or on church sponsored events or excursions. MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID VOLUNTEERS (MHFA)

These people in our congregation are trained to listen, be supportive and offer resources to those who wish to talk about an issue, or feelings that are disruptive in their daily lives. MHFA volunteers are not giving professional advice; not to be therapists, not to diagnose, but to listen and offer support and with the training learn how to engage the stressed person and develop a plan for self-care. That self-care might include having someone they know come be with them. It could be suggesting that they talk with a mental health professional, if they are not in acute crisis or suicidal.

As our church edged out of pandemic status, the MHFA trained people participated in a 'simulation training' to enhance their listening skills and reinforce confidence in what they had learned in the training during COVID restrictions.

Two consecutive classes were offered on Suicide Prevention and Experiences of Suicide Thoughts or Suicide by Family or Friends.

Tools2Thrive is a series of taped self-care modules and some essays provided by professionals in our congregation as a resource to be used as a resource at anytime and remain a part of the church's website content.

There has been a weekly commitment to provide W.I.S.E. articles of mental health wellness and illness in the weekly church bulletins. Pastor Jim Alexander is the constant in this program. Providing guidance, assuring weekly mental health topics, graphs or soliciting writing from church members to keep 'good mental health goals' available to our congregants.

Generally the focus has been on recognized 'national mental health topics for the month'; and others have been designed to meet our individual congregational needs. Such as those dealing with the complexities of COVID and isolation, domestic violence basic education, different mental health diagnosis, and frequent articles on self-care and healthy patterns for one's own stability and resilience in this busy stressful world.

If in reading this article of the history and current work of W.I.S.E. at The Church of the Palms, you find interest in pursuing this volunteer commitment, please contact Pastor Jim Alexander through the church office. He is coordinating with a local retired care community that has a trained facilitator to arrange additional training for new volunteers.

As a member of The Church of the Palm's W.I.S.E Team it is a privilege to be trusted with conversations and an honor for each W.I.S.E. Team member to be a supportive caring person available for this congregation.
