
As you complete this inventory, you may discover new gifts, new affirmations, and new surprises.



# Water Bottle Donation Drive for Children First Academy



For the last several years our church has provided bottled water for kids attending Children First Academy (a school for homeless kids near downtown Phoenix). The water is provided to kids as they ride the bus to and from school in the hot months of the year. This year we will be providing reusable water bottles. The school has installed drinking fountains (like the one near our King Hall entrance) which have a spout for refillable water bottles. This eliminates the need for the plastic water bottles which are used once and discarded. Inexpensive eight and twelve

ounce reusable bottles can be purchased at Walmart or Target stores. We will be collecting these reusable bottles during the months of March and April. Please consider picking up a package and bringing them to the Donations Area near the Narthex during March and April. Or, if you wish to make a donation to support this effort, place cash or check in a church envelope and mark it. **HELP HOMELESS KIDS & SAVE THE ENVIRONMENT.** Thank you!



## Lenten Study Sacred Self-Care

Can you sit or stand in front of a mirror and repeat this affirmation? "I am created in the image of God. I am God's

perfect gift." What thoughts come to mind? In her book Dr. Chanequa Walker-Barnes says that our self—the mind-body-spirit that makes up who we are—is God's first and best qift to each of us. But often we treat that gift carelessly. Our Lenten Study will examine this and many other aspects of self-care. A few copies of the book Sacred Self-Care: Daily Practices for Nurturing Our Whole Selves, will be available in the church office. The book is available on Amazon for \$9.99 for the print version and \$16 for the Kindle version. Dave Klingensmith will lead three more sessions (March 26<sup>th</sup>, April 2<sup>nd</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> from 10:00—11:00a in the Behle Resource Center) where participants can share how they're doing at their own self-care. ## Rainbows Festival

The Rainbows Festival is on Saturday,

April 5<sup>th</sup> and Sunday, April 6<sup>th</sup>! The festival hours are from 10:00a to 6:00p!

The annual Rainbows Festival & Street Fair is a celebration of the diversity of the LGBTQ+ community. The event is located in historic Heritage Square Park in Downtown Phoenix. Each year, the Rainbows Festival draws a crowd of over 25,000 friends, families, and allies. Rainbows Festival is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest LGBTQ+ event in the state of Arizona, only 2<sup>nd</sup> to the Phoenix Pride Festival. It is a free event open to the public that hosts over 150 exhibitors and sponsors throughout the two-day event and has two stages filled with entertainment throughout the weekend. With the cancellation of the I-HELP program, questions have been expressed regarding the Shower Trailer. The answer is the shower trailer will continue to offer showers to the homeless with no change in schedule or funding. We have a very small budget (less that \$20K) due to the dedication of unpaid volunteers and use of the church truck. The bulk of our funding comes from grants provided by the cities of Surprise and Peoria and the Sun City Rotary Club.

We welcome individual gifts for the shower ministry. Recently a man stopped at the trailer in Bicentennial Park in Surprise and gave us a \$100 bill in appreciation for what we were doing. Excess funds go into an account to replace the trailer when needed.
