Lenten Study Sacred Self-Care

Dave Klingensmith will lead our LAST SESSION April 9th from 10:00a-11:00a in the Behle Resource Center. Participants can share how they're doing at their own self-care. Even if you can't come to the class you are encouraged to get the book and care for yourself.

What's after IHELP? A group of 40 gathered on March 31st to learn that the City of Surprise Human Services is seeking funding and administrative support for a 2.0 version. We discussed volunteer possibilities around our homeless ministry now that IHELP closed.

Here are ways to stay involved:

- Help with TCOTP's Feet & More Shower Trailer (contact Max Klinkenborg).
- Join TCOTP's advocacy network to contact legislators about Senate and House bills (contact Tom Theisen).
- Collaborate with summer heat relief programs in this area (contact City of Surprise Resource Center 623.222.4673).
- Learn about ways to connect homeless with street outreach services (contact Phoenix Rescue Mission 602.346.3361 or City of Surprise 623.222.1550 about an app for your phone called SAFE). A team is checking with two homeless shelters in Surprise to see if we would partner with them by bringing an evening meal on Monday nights.

Here are a few thoughts that were shared about the Heart Joys of IHELP:

- Blessings from all who ate with us.
- Successful temporary housing of overnight guests for five plus years.
- My heart filled and eyes teared when guests had two to three helpings of food. Some said it was the first food in two days.
- Meeting new friends who are hopeful of their future.
- Knowing our guests were clean, fed, and rested.
- People treated with dignity.
- The Church living our mission.

LIFELONG LEARNING

The Holy Bible serves as one of our primary sources for shaping our faith and the structure of our beliefs. However, we often forget that our English translations and paraphrases of the Bible are based upon documents written in a language that no one has spoke in a millennium. What happens when that integrity is not maintained? What effect can that have on our beliefs? To give one perspective of this problem, Lifelong Learning will present the film 1946: The Mistranslation that shifted the Culture on April 16th at 10:00a in King Hall with a discussion following led by Mark Makowski. Please sign up in the Narthex the next two Sundays so that we can estimate the number of people willing to attend.

"LET'S TALK SUICIDE: IT IS NOT A TABOO TOPIC, IT IS A NEEDED DIALOGUE"

April 25th and May 3rd (both Saturdays) there will be Part I & II (two) classes on suicide; 1:00p to 2:30p (or 3:00) in the boardroom. Class size is limited to 20 participants; pre-registration is required. Sign up in the Narthex of the church. Kay Klinkenborg will be the lead facilitator. All professional research validates that openly talking about suicide saves lives! This will be a safe (unrecorded) environment to talk about one of the most difficult subjects in our lives. A sacred circle of safety will be the environment for learning (personal sharing is not expected or mandatory). Words hard to say suicide and suicide prevention. This is an opportunity to learn tools, resources and creative ways to have a real conversation with the people in your life. You don't need special training to have an open, authentic conversation about mental health. Bringing up the subject of suicide DOES NOT increase the chances that a person will become suicidal or be more apt to act on such thoughts or impulses. In fact, it is just the opposite. See April's Palm Leaf for a complete description of the class and topics. Klinkenborg currently is a spiritual Director/Companion; a retired RN, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT) and Clinical Member of AAMFT (American Assoc of Marriage & Family Therapists). The facilitators are members of The Church of the Palms. Cold water provided; break time; bring a snack to eat at your discretion.
